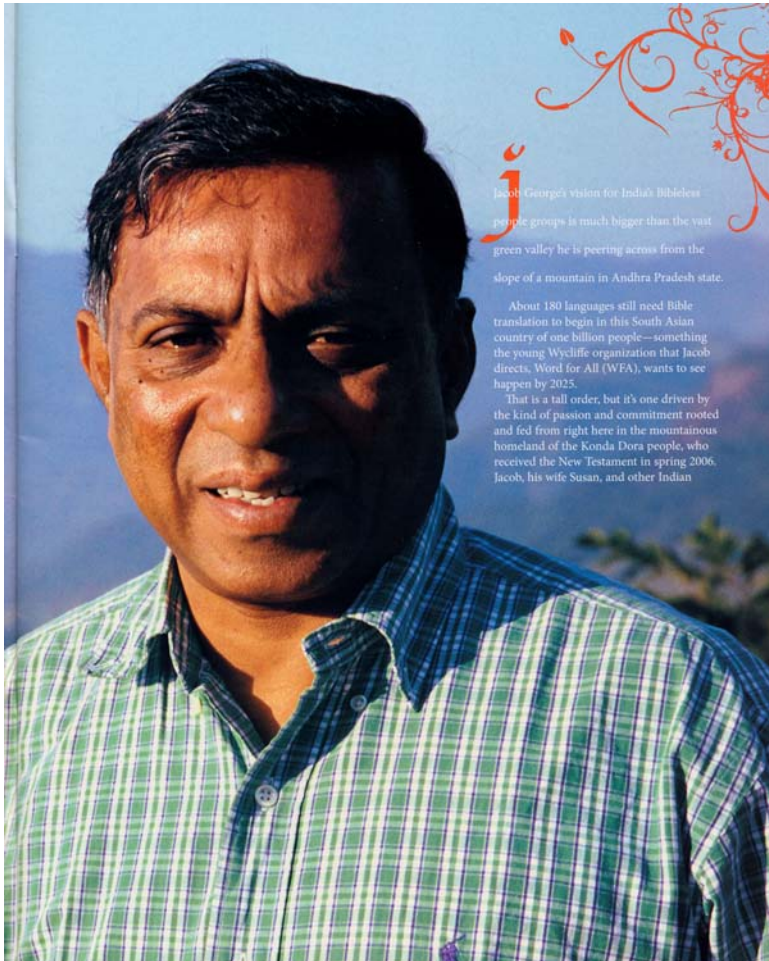


WORD FOR ALL



Jacob George's vision for India's Bibleless people groups is much bigger than the vast green valley he is peering across from the slope of a mountain in Andhra Pradesh state.

About 180 languages still need Bible translation to begin in this South Asian country of one billion people—something the young Wycliffe organization that Jacob directs, Word for All (WFA), wants to see happen by 2025.

That is a tall order, but it's one driven by the kind of passion and commitment rooted and fed from right here in the mountainous homeland of the Konda Dora people, who received the New Testament in spring 2006. Jacob, his wife Susan, and other Indian

They have set a goal of beginning Bible translation in five new projects in minority languages in 2007.
